INTRODUCTION ABOUT SAMSTHA



The 125-years-old parent body has been committed to "Empowerment of Women through Education". The Samstha works relentlessly towards educating the women and thereby making themselves self-reliant. The Samstha was established in 1896 by the great visionary and social worker Bharatratna Maharshi Dhondo Keshav Karve to provide shelter to destitute women.

Karve founded this Institution with the objectives of upliftment, emancipation and education of women who formed a major section of the socially downtrodden. Maharshi Karve dedicated his whole life for this humanitarian cause with great determination and courage. For his sacrifice and dedicated social work and his contribution to the noble cause he was awarded "Bharatratna" the highest National Civilian Award.

Establishment of the Institution

On 14th June, 1896, in the village 'Hingne' near Pune city, Maharshi Karve started a "Home for Widows", along with a school for Widows, so that they become educated and self-reliant. The "Home for Widows" was then named as 'Hingne Stree Shikshan Samstha' and the school was named 'Mahila ashram High School'.

Development of the Institution

Maharshi Karve Stree Shikshan Samstha, Pune has branches all over Maharashtra in India and more than 30,000 girl students are learning in these institutions. Over the period of the last 125

Years, the Institution has grown like a banyan tree and at present it runs 65 educational and other units under its umbrella. These units are located at Pune, Satara, Wai, Ratnagiri, Nagpur, Kamshet and Vasai. All these units are meant exclusively for girls or women. We also have hostel and medical facilities for students and working women and an old age home for senior citizens.

The Institution offers education from Kindergarten, Pre-Primary, Primary, Secondary, Higher Secondary schools to Higher Education Colleges. At present the Institution runs higher education units like, Engineering, Architecture, Management, Nursing, Fashion Technology, Vocational Training Institute, Laser Technology & Applications, Jewelry Design, etc. With the changing trends in the jobs market, courses like Data Science, Artificial Intelligence, Machine learning, laser technology, Automotive Mechatronics have been started in the Samstha.



Introduction of our institute:

Sitabai Nargundkar College of Nursing was established in August 2007. It now has around 400 girl students pursuing nursing courses i.e. Basic B.Sc. Nursing and post basic B.Sc. Nursing. The Institute is approved by the Indian Nursing Council (INC), Delhi and Maharashtra Nursing Council (MNC), Mumbai, Maharashtra University of Health Sciences (MUHS), Nashik and Government of Maharashtra. Hence, to ensure this Nursing teachers', supervisors', and students' knowledge should at all times be relevant, up-to-date and evidence based. College has qualified nursing teachers with up to

date evidence based knowledge, to train nurse graduates. Many of the teachers appointed at college have various other disciplinary degrees, into their credit.

- College is affiliated with various renowned hospitals of the city, where students are getting first hand clinical experiences in real hospital settings.
- College is imparting special sessions on CPR, First aid, labour management, care of patients in ICU, care of post operative patients, therapeutic communication and many more.
- Add on certificate courses to develop and refine clinical nursing skills like ACLS, PCLS, management of Labour, ICU care, OT care, etc. will be started, phase wise.
- 7. Appropriate integration of Indian Knowledge system (teaching in Indian Language, culture, using online course):
- The medium of instruction is English. But, wherever required the teachers use Hindi and Marathi language also in the classroom, while teaching. This results in better understanding of the subject by students. Students are also encouraged to express themselves in hindi or local language (marathi), wherever required. Hindi Diwas, Marathi diwas are being celebrated in the college.
- Special classes to teach marathi to non marathi speaking students will be organised as a part of preclinical induction program to facilitate smooth communication in clinical and community areas.

Indian culture is given importance in day to day routine activities of the college. National festivals are celebrated, birth and death anniversaries of national heroes, social reformers, are observed. Various cultural events like Dahi Handi, Garba, Diwali, etc are being celebrated at the college.
